

Senate Election Regulations

Composition of the Senate

- I. The Senate shall be chaired by the President/Vice-Chancellor or his nominee. The Chair of the Senate shall determine who shall chair a meeting in his absence
- II. The ordinary membership of the Senate shall comprise:
 - 25 faculty representatives; 15 elected in faculties and at least 10 appointed by the
 President and Vice-Chancellor to ensure equal representation of faculties,
 representation of international staff, and gender balance within the Senate.
 - Representatives from key academic support departments
 - 3 student representatives: Student Union President and 2 elected members from other SU heads and/or SU faculty presidents
- III. The provost shall be a permanent member of the Senate
- IV. Each faculty is to be represented by at least one seat in the Senate
- V. Faculties that exceed 100 academic staff members are to be represented by two seats
- VI. Faculty candidates: Fulltime Lecturers, Assistant Professors, and Professors
- VII. The Senate can appoint observers from the academic or non-academic community, including Teaching Assistants, Assistant Lecturers, employees from key departments, and students
- VIII. Candidates must have spent at least 2 years of full-time employment at the university



Term of Office

Academic and Administrative Staff

- I. The term of office for academic and administrative staff is two years, starting from the first day of holding office
- II. Academic staff members may stand for a maximum of two terms in the Senate
- III. There is no cap to the number of terms in which administrative staff may stand

Students

IV. The term of office for undergraduate student members will be one year. Successful candidates may stand for a maximum of two terms in the Senate

Election Dates and Conduct of Election Process

- I. Elections will be held bi-annually (or annually in case of need or empty seats) and will be run by the Senate Elections Office
- II. Time of elections: during the first month of the second semester, no later than March
- III. A call for nominations shall be sent with a link to a self-nomination form that includes candidate information, picture, and candidate statement
- IV. A final document with all nominees from each faculty shall be circulated to voting members within the faculty

Voting Arrangements

- I. Voting will be open for one day communicated in advance by the Senate Elections Office
- II. Voting boxes will be present at faculties, supervised by a member of the faculty and an independent external member
- III. All academic staff members of the faculty will be eligible to vote (Teaching Assistants, Assistant Lecturers, Lecturers, Assistant Professors, and Professors)
- IV. The Senate Elections Office will oversee the whole process and shall be copied in all and any official communication by faculties concerning the elections
